

Cubing & Chargeable Weight Rules

Definitions

Stackable	Can load beneath other freight.
Top-Loadable	Can load on top of other freight.
Non-Stackable	Can not stack on top of or beneath other freight.
Overlength	Single pallet or piece greater than 144 inches (12 feet) long.

Shipment Scenario	Cube Rule
- Stackable or Non-stackable or Top-loadable - Under 639.9 cube feet or 9.9 lineal feet of trailer total	- Subject to 10 lbs per cubic foot
- Stackable or Non-stackable or Top-loadable - 640 cubic feet or 10 lineal feet of trailer total or over	- Subject to 1000 lbs per lineal foot
- US and Cross-border shipments - 640 cubic feet or 10 lineal feet of trailer total or over	- Subject to 750 lbs per lineal foot at class 70 - Will not apply if less than original class charge
- Pallets or pieces are Overlength (144 inches – 240 inches)	- Subject to Accessorial Charge - Subject to 10 lbs per cubic foot
- Pallets or pieces are Overlength (241 inches and greater)	- Subject to Accessorial Charge - Subject to 10 lbs per cubic foot

** Chargeable weight is equal to the greater of actual weight or cubed weight as determined by the above.

*** In the event that the customer fails to declare dimensions on the Bill of Lading, Kindersley Transport Ltd. reserves the right to ascribe to any such shipment the proper measurements upon pickup or delivery.
